Course description:

The learning of a foreign language gives you a perspective on a wider world. It fosters the knowledge and understanding of other cultures and the desire to travel and interact with them. Year 13 Exam

PAPER 1: Listening, reading and translation

2hr, 80 marks, 40% of A level Listening to and responding to a variety of passages. Reading and responding to a variety of passages. Translation from Spanish to English

PAPER 2: Written response to works and translation

2hr 40 min, 120 marks, 30% of A level Translation from English to Spanish. Two essays, one on each of the books and films you have studied.

PAPER 3: Speaking

22-23 minutes, 72 marks, 30% of AS Discussing a stimulus card presented to you in the exam. Present your findings from an independent research paper.

Methods of Assessment:

Terminal exam at end of Year 13.
