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SCHA BTEC Blended Learning Policy (Covid 2020-21)

Definition of Blended Learning:

"Blended Learning is an approach to education that combines online educational materials and opportunities for interaction online with traditional place-based classroom methods. It requires the physical presence of both teacher and student, with some elements of student control over time, place, path, or place."

- Blended Learning offers the learner convenience and flexibility; they have the ability to control their learning pace and learn remotely.
- Academic research suggests that blended learning gives learners a more comprehensive understanding of the course content.
- As blended learning allows learners to interact with instructors and fellow learners, social learning is supported.

Aims and purpose of SCHA BTEC Blended Learning Policy:

- To ensure that standards relating to Blended Learning are consistent, transparent and in line with the requirements of Pearson and the Academy.
- To support learners that have to self-isolate from Covid-19 in accessing learning and completing work from home.
- To ensure there are no barriers to any BTEC programmes the academy offers.

Considerations within the policy:

- Needs to be available to everyone who can achieve the required standard
- Needs to be free from barriers which restrict access to progression
- We need to provide a system and framework for all learners so as to have as little negative impact on their learning as possible.
- We need to support learners who may not have access to laptops to complete assignments
- We must be observant of the particular requirements of individuals, including those who may require support to undertake learning and assessment

Blended Learning approaches to support students in case of self-isolation or lock down:

a) BTEC / Tech Award Level 1 and 2 Courses Year 9 - 11

What will be taught:

- Year 9 will be taught core theory needed for the course as a baseline year.
- All mandatory units will be taught in the first instance for all year 10 and 11 as per the Pearson guidance.
- In the case of self-isolation, students will have access to the same learning resources as their peers. This will be accessed via Microsoft Teams.
- Staff will keep in contact with those students who are self-isolating via email.
- All subjects will provide students access to additional learning platforms.

Accessing work during self-isolation or lock down:

- All departments will create a termly plan in line with their assessment plans. The plan will
 include what the year group will be studying and the work that they will be completing each
 week. Resources will be made available on Microsoft Teams.
- Completed resources will be shared with the Director of E Learning, Vice Principal: Teaching and Learning, the relevant Director of Year and Curriculum Leader.
- For those that are self-isolating the termly resources will be accessible via the school website www.hatttonacademy.org.uk

BTEC Level 3 courses Year 12 and 13

What will be taught:


- All mandatory units will be taught in the first instance for all year 12 and 13 as per Pearson guidance
- In the case of self-isolation students will have access to the same learning resources as their peers. This will be accessible via Microsoft Teams; students should be invited into live lessons.
- Staff will keep in contact with those students who are self-isolating via email.
- All subjects will provide students with additional online learning platforms

Accessing work during self-isolation or lock down:

- In the case of self-isolation, work for students will be made available on Microsoft Teams
- Students in the sixth form will be taught remotely via Microsoft Teams in the case of both self-isolation and lock down.

 In the case of lock down it is the responsibility of teaching staff to keep in contact with classes and report any students who miss the live sessions and deadlines to the sixth form leadership team.

Access to ICT all years:

Where computer access is not available for students the school's lead internal verifier will
contact the Co-Principals via email: head@hattonacademy.org.uk who will arrange to
provide students with a laptop to loan. Priority should be given to those year groups that
have to complete coursework.

Submission of assignments remotely:

• Staff will store students' work centrally on Microsoft Teams.

Responsibility

a) Responsibility of Quality Nominee

- Ensure that students who are not accessing remote learning are followed up by teaching staff and any issues are reported to the relevant Director of Years
